There is a need for support of public transportation projects such as Metrolink's Tier 4 Locomotive procurement to ensure a better environment for Southern Californians. 
Strategy/Objective

The main objectives of the press event were to inform stakeholders, riders and communities of benefits of the Tier 4 locomotives addition to the Metrolink fleet and to engage key stakeholders through positive recognition. Metrolink produced a successful press event with great coverage to spread the word with a "Clean Power Tour" theme. This event was the kick-off of a region-wide tour of the new locomotives. Some major benefits from the new Tier 4 locomotive fleet are:

- Will reduce particulate matter and nitrogen oxide emissions by up to 85%
- Will have up to 64% more horsepower allowing Metrolink to move people more quickly and reliably resulting in additional cars off the road
- Will idle quieter than the Tier 0 locomotives
- Are equipped with safety enhancements such as positive train control and crash energy management






