

The long range transit services plan, DART Forward 2035, was originally adopted in 2011. To inform the Five Year update, **DART surveyed the community** earlier this year and learned:


















# What is your transit priority?

In the public survey conducted earlier this year, riders, non-riders and past-riders indicated there are five elements essential to the future of public transit in our region. We want to know which of these elements is most important to you.

Your feedback will be used to determine what is included in the final DART Forward 2035 plan.


Access: How close a bus stop is to home or work

**Availability:** Number of hours during the day buses operate

**Experience:** How enjoyable it is to ride the bus

**Flexibility:** How many transportation choices riders have

Frequency: How often buses arrive at stops



# What should the future of public transit look like in Greater Des Moines?

The region is growing faster than expected, with growth now expected to exceed original 2035 projections around 2020. DART hired a transportation consulting company, TMD, to update its long range transit services plan, the blueprint for providing public transit in Greater Des Moines. Market research shows that the region's population is expected to grow 34% and jobs are expected to grow 24% by 2030.

Based on these growth projections and feedback from the community, DART and TMD prepared three plan options with different levels of access, availability, experience, flexibility and frequency. **Review a summary of the key differences** in each plan below and **click on the system route map** for details. 
# Which option do you prefer?




