

WHAT IS THE YOUTH GOPASS?

The Youth GoPass allows youth, ages 13-18, to ride GoTriangle, GoRaleigh, GoCary and GoDurham buses free of charge! Find out how to get yours at youthgopass.com.

6 THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- 1 Have your Youth GoPass ready to swipe when you board the bus.
- 2 A Youth GoPass may not be used by anyone except the person to whom it was issued. It is not transferable.
- 3 Be respectful! It's important to be kind to the driver and other riders, especially the elderly and those with special needs. The seats in the front of the bus are reserved for them. If someone needs a reserved seat, please sit elsewhere or stand.
- 4 If you get lost or turned around, simply ask your driver for help. They are there to assist you.
- 5 Your pass is good on GoTriangle, GoRaleigh, GoCary and GoDurham, so getting around the Triangle has never been easier!
- 6 You can track the arrival of your bus on the TransLoc Rider app. Download it from translocrider.com and start your adventure!

GETTING YOUR GOPASS

Visit youthgopass.com for a full list of locations including transit agencies, libraries, regional centers and community centers.

To obtain a Youth GoPass you will be asked to provide proof of age. You may bring a birth certificate, valid school ID with school year, driver's license or other government issued ID with date of birth.

TAKING THE BUS

Once you've determined the route you need to take, head to your stop 5-10 minutes early.

When the bus pulls up, check the bus number and destination on the headsign to make sure you are getting on the correct bus. If unsure, check with the driver.

Have your Youth GoPass ready to swipe as you board the front of the bus. Immediately sit down or stand, holding the nearest strap or pole if seats are full.

BRINGING YOUR BIKE

All GoTriangle, GoRaleigh, GoCary and GoDurham buses are equipped with bike racks.

If you are traveling with a bike, inform your driver prior to boarding, then mount your bike on the rack on the front of the bus. If you are unsure about how to do so, please ask your driver.

Prior to exiting the bus at your stop, please remind the driver that you will be removing your bike from the rack.

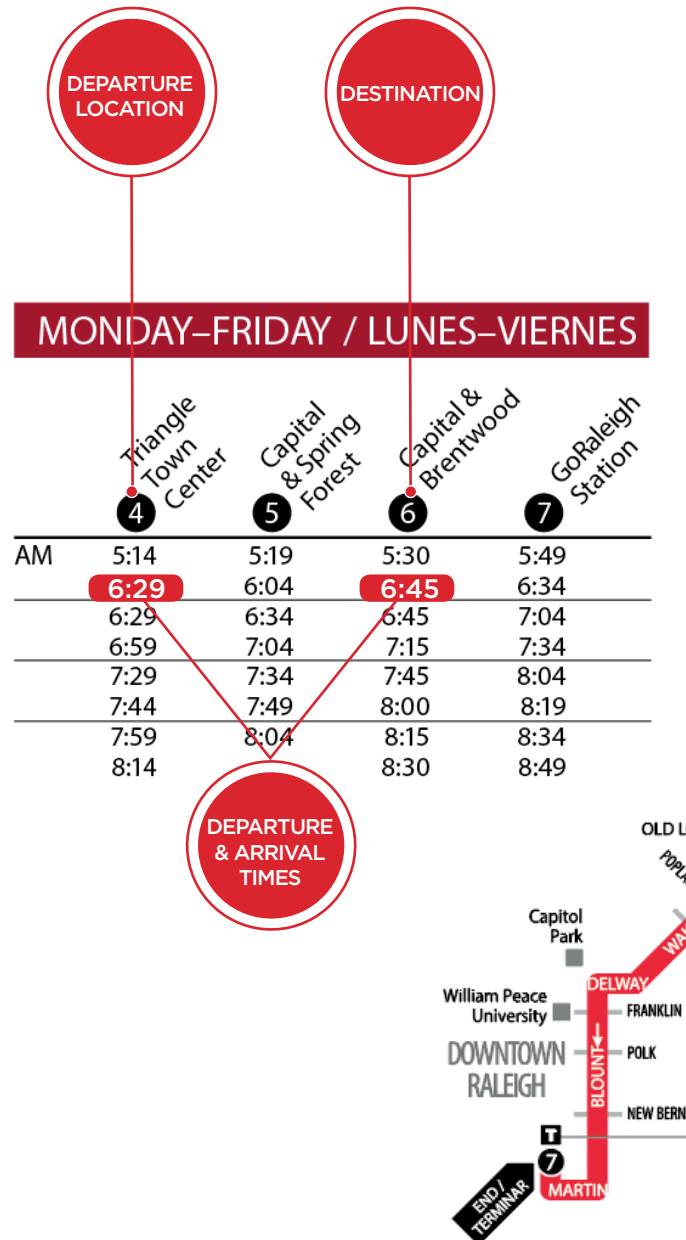
EXITING THE BUS

Pull the cord above your seat to notify the driver that you want to get off at the next stop.

Before exiting, make sure you have all of your belongings.

Exit the bus from the rear door and wait until the bus passes to cross the street. This helps the boarding process go smoothly and keeps you safe.

UNDERSTANDING

the schedules & timetables

Once you've mapped your trip and know which bus or buses you need to take, you can view your schedule online or pick up a copy at your local transit agency. When viewing your schedule, you'll notice timepoints are listed across the top. Find where you'd like to be picked up and dropped off.

Most of the stops on a route are not timepoints. To find out when the bus will arrive or depart at another stop, you'll need to estimate based on the times listed for the timepoint before the stop and the timepoint after it.
